BOARD OF TRUSTEES UPDATE

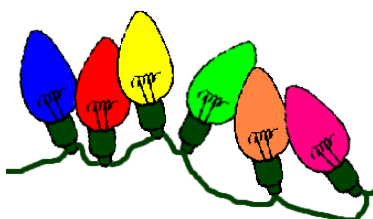
On behalf of the Board of Trustees, thank you to the school community for an excellent year at Paraparaumu Beach School. The year has seen some outstanding sporting, academic and cultural achievements for our students, which reflects the passion that our teachers and staff have for providing the best environment for growing minds and bodies. YEAR 5'S NEW CHROME BOOKS

Bring your Chromebooks (and your child) to school on 30 January to get set up for school.

We will have our technician in the Central Resource Room (by Rm 13) on site. This should be a quick job where your child's Chromebook will get connected with the school server and a school Google Account. To avoid everyone coming at one time, we have set up the following schedule:

If you can't make the day, the Technician will be back in on Friday, but we are hopeful to get most new Year 5's sorted before school starts.

Please note: You can use your Chromebook at home over the summer. This will not affect the school set up.

END OF YEAR WRITTEN REPORTS

The majority to students will receive an end-of-year report on the last day of school. Those who will not be receiving a report are mainly Yr 0-3 students who are not due for an 'interim' or 'anniversary' report at this time of year. Recent arrivals to the school may also not receive a report (or may receive a limited one).

As per our regular practice, reports will not be given out prior to the last day. Children who are not present at school on that day will have their report mailed out. Reports are in a sealed envelope addressed to parents/guardians, and it is our expectation that they arrive home unopened. For those children returning to this school next year, also included in the envelope is notification of class placement and teacher for 2018; and an appropriate stationery list. **Please remember the school does not sell bulk stationery.**

RECENT STUDENT ACHIEVEMENTS:

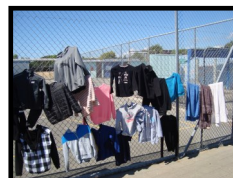
Archery: Congratulations to Jenson Young who shot at his first archery tournament and won a silver medal in the Manawatu Turbine Tournament recently.
